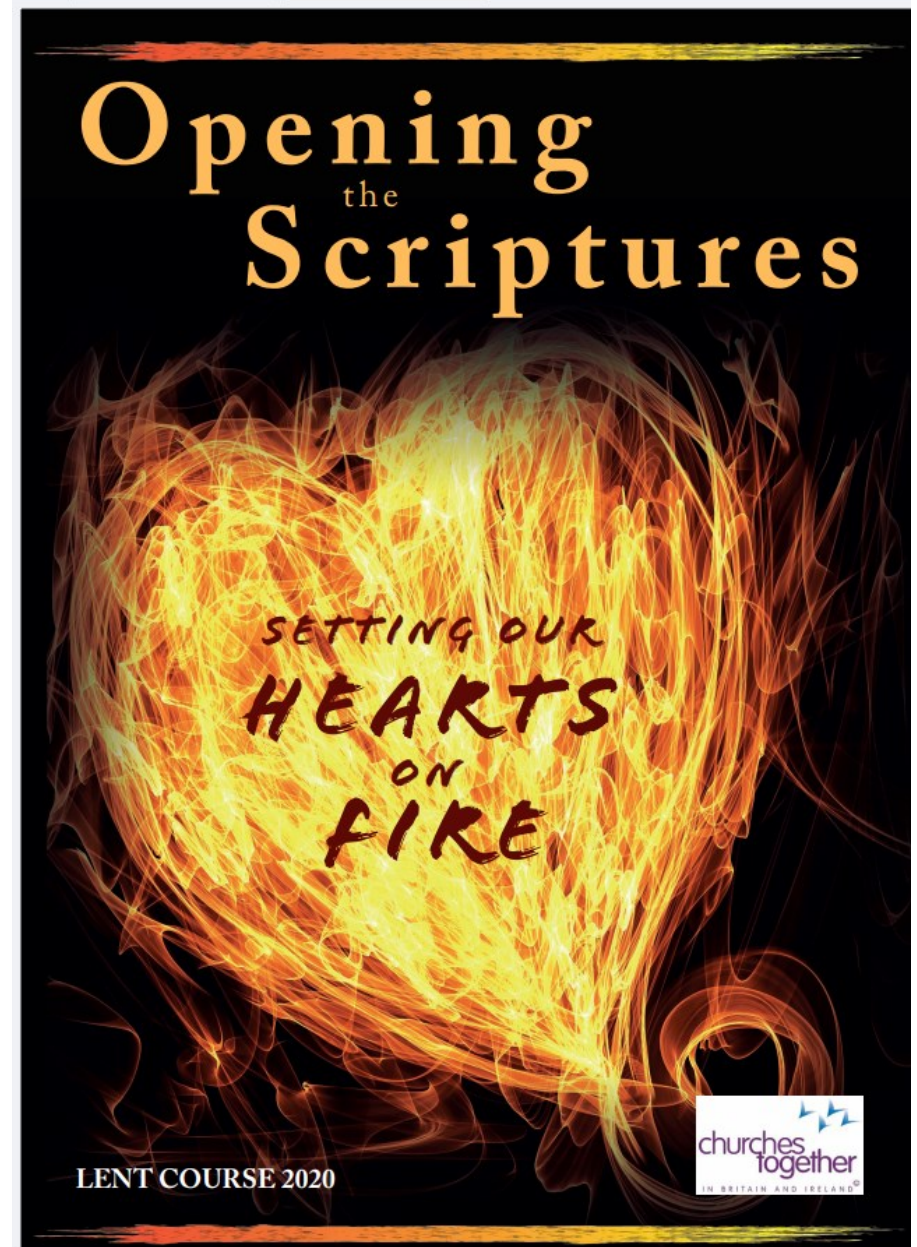

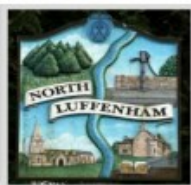

Churches can now apply for grants from their parish and town councils

Clarification of legislation confirms that churches can now apply for grants from their parish and town councils. The Levelling-Up and Regeneration Bill, which received Royal Assent on 26 October 2023, has been amended to make clear that parish and town councils can provide financial support to churches for repairs and improvements. There have been calls for some time for amendments to be made to the law due to the original language being ambiguous and preventing churches from making applications. The amendment was introduced after The Right Reverend Vivienne Faull, Bishop of Bristol, highlighted the need for clarification of the law during the Bill's committee stage in the House of Lords.

Revd Stephen Trott of Pitsford with Boughton has long been lobbying, along with others, for changes to the bill and said of the recent announcement, 'It is extraordinary good news for churches which stand in the area of a parish council, since this will remove any doubt that they are able to seek parish council funding like any other community organisation within the parish, both for buildings and for their activities as an organisation embracing residents of the parish.'

Following the policy of achieving Net Zero by 2030, this amendment is very timely as many churches are looking into ways that they can make changes to use less energy and emit less carbon and this may provide an opportunity to seek funding to achieve this.



New Parish Treasurer Support Service

If you're struggling to find a Parish Treasurer, the Diocese can now offer a book keeping service to ensure that parishes can still fulfil their statutory obligations by producing annual accounts and regular reports for PCC meetings. As part of this, we can also work with the parish to provide Gift Aid Claims and applications for VAT reclaims through the listed places of worship grant scheme. We can also help parishes work out a budget.

Bishop of Peterborough

Bishop Debbie was confirmed as the 39th Bishop of Peterborough in a special service at Lambeth Palace on Wednesday 13 December. The service, which is steeped in history and tradition, took place in the presence of the Archbishop of Canterbury in the Court of the Vicar General.

Whilst this means that Bishop Debbie is now legally the Bishop of Peterborough, her duties will be delegated to Bishop John until her installation at Peterborough Cathedral on 3rd March when her public ministry will begin.



During the service Archbishop Justin gave a charge to Bishop Debbie, calling on her to remember 'above all the one who has commissioned you' saying 'the most important thing is not who you are but whose you are', and asking her to challenge as well as being challenged, to uphold the unity of the Church, to explore opportunities for effective ministry and mission and to encourage clergy and laity alike in their discernment and strengths.
