Thoughts from Rev'd Peter Collins

The prophet Isaiah living at a time of fear, uncertainty, and political unrest offers divine words of comfort and hope:

“ Do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you ...”(41.10)

The prophet speaks into today's political climate of polarisation, civil unrest, social dislocation, austerity, and misinformation, all of which negatively impact our mental, physical, spiritual health, and quality of life.

We were not created to live in such an emotional rollercoaster of anxieties and fears but in faith, trusting in God rather than the surrounding culture of distorted narratives and false beliefs. We were not created to live at such a frantic pace controlled by technology, apps and algorithms, but as relational beings caring for one another, and as sabbath beings requiring time for rest and reflection.

Maybe our New Year resolutions should include more time for those whom we love and who love us, more time to 'stop and stare' at the beauty of our Rutland countryside, and more time to trust in God who strengthens, upholds, loves and cherishes each one of his children?

Tukaram, philosopher and poet offers this prayer of encouragement which seems so appropriate as we journey into a New Year:

Of what avail this restless, hurrying activity?
This heavy weight of earthly duties?
God's purposes stand firm,
And thou, his little one,
Needest one thing alone:
Trust in his power, and he will meet thy need.
Thy burden resteth safe on him,
And thou, his little one,
Mayst play securely at his side.
This is the sum and substance of it all:
God is,
God loveth thee,
God beareth all thy care.

EDITH WESTON HISTORICAL NOTE



In October a friend sent me a link to an auction, I opened it expecting to see a book or similar, so I couldn't believe it when I saw my grandad's old cart looking back at me; I quite thought it would have been scrapped and probably cut up years ago.

Friends said 'you must buy it', which is all very well but then what? It is not something you can put on the mantelpiece and admire. The auction was at a farm near Wincanton, Somerset. When I looked at the map, I realised Derek one of my old "Edithwestonians" lived nearby. So, I bought it and that was when the coincidences started.

Turned out that Derek lives half a mile away from the seller, 180 miles from here. What are the chances of that! Not only that but Derek decided pay a visit to Edith Weston, so he loaded it on to his car trailer and delivered it two days later.

It would have gone out of the same gate that it came back in, just few yards from where it lived all those years ago. I have spoken to the seller who said he bought it 15 years ago, so I am trying to find out where else it's been as it must have left here in perhaps the 1960s/1970s.

Going back in time my dad was born at 22 Well Cross, then the family moved back into the farm house. Next in at No 22 was Derek's grandad and the next baby born there was Derek's mother. The cart was made in 1921 and in that year Derek's grandad Charlie Thorpe was working for my grandad on the farm.

It would be good to find some info on the Healey's of Empingham, if

anyone reading this is related to them, or knows any of the history of Healey & Son, please get in touch.
