





VOLUNTARY ACTION RUTLAND

Needing help to get to an appointment or to visit friends and relations locally? Register with Voluntary Action Rutland (VAR)

Over a decade ago, the North Luffenham Good Neighbour Scheme was established to support frail, vulnerable, disabled, or elderly residents who needed, amongst other things, help to get to appointments when family, friends or neighbours were unable to assist. Since Covid, the demand for the scheme has dwindled significantly and, like so many other similar schemes, it has found itself less than sustainable, so the decision has been made to

disband the scheme.

For the very few who have used the scheme over the last couple of years, there is an excellent alternative its place when family, friends, or neighbours cannot assist. Voluntary Action Rutland is the place to turn. They are a highly professional organisation, registered with the Charity Commission, and serve over 2300 'Clients' locally in Rutland. What they offer is broader than that which the Good Neighbour Scheme was able to offer. If you are in possession of a valid bus pass, you will also receive a 50% reduction in the cost of any trip using VAR. Even if you are not actually in need of support at this moment, it is good to register with VAR as a potential user so that should you require their support in the future you are already registered on their books.

VAR can be contacted on 01572 724705 and their office hours are Monday to Friday 0900 to 1200 (* answer machine in operation out of hours.)
